

## Rules for visitors at Deutsches Technikmuseum in Berlin

### Welcome to Deutsches Technikmuseum (German Museum of Technology)!

#### Opening hours

Tuesday to Friday	09:00 am to 05:30 pm
Saturday / Sunday	10:00 am to 06:00 pm
Monday	closed

On public holidays or for other occasions, special opening hours may apply. These can be found on our website.

#### General

Children are very welcome. However, children under the age of 10 are only permitted to visit the museum when accompanied by adults.

#### Free admission

Children and teenagers up to 18 years old or until the completion of their schooling upon presentation of their student ID.

Upon presentation of proof or a corresponding identification, the following individuals also receive free admission:

- Teachers preparing a museum visit
- Accompanying individuals of a school/childcare group
- One accompanying person for individuals with disabilities (with corresponding annotation on the disability ID card)
- Members of the *Freunde und Förderer des Deutschen Technikmuseums Berlin e.V.*, as well as the *Förderkreises Zucker-Museum e.V.*
- Members of ICOM, DMB, and BeMu
- Press representatives

- Members of the Berlin City Guides Alliance e.V. (BBS)
- Users of the library or archive
- Holders of the Museum Pass Berlin
- Holders of the Berlin and Brandenburg Volunteer Card
- Refugees (with proof of arrival or residence permit; accompanied groups from refugee assistance)
- Other complimentary tickets (e.g., Dinamix, cooperation with the Museum of Natural History)

### **7. Museum Sunday – free of entry**

On the first Sunday of each month, admission is free to everybody. Free Tickets are only available through the [Museum Sunday website](#). Tickets cannot be purchased on site at the museum.

For special exhibitions and events, an additional admission fee may be charged.

The admission ticket is valid on the same day at the German Museum of Technology, Trebbiner Straße, at the Science Center Spectrum, and in the exhibition area Ladestraße, access via Möckernstraße. Please keep your ticket safe.

### **For your visit to the Deutsches Technikmuseum, we kindly ask you to observe some rules.**

#### **Lockers, Objects and Animals**

- Backpacks and larger bags can be locked in the lockers. Group containers are available for school classes and daycare groups in which they can store their backpacks. Umbrellas must also be included.
- In the Science Center Spectrum, all backpacks and large bags must be deposited for security reasons.
- A fee of €20 will be charged for lost locker keys.
- Sports and larger play equipment as well as luggage and other bulky items are not allowed in the exhibition rooms.
- The bringing of animals is generally not allowed, except for assistance dogs for people with disabilities.

#### **Conduct in the exhibition rooms and in the museum park**

- Follow the instructions of the visitor attendants.
- For the documentation and communication of historical contexts, we also exhibit objects with unconstitutional symbols in our exhibitions. Visitors are prohibited from photographing or filming with a clear focus on these symbols and/or posing in front of them.
- Visitors carrying or using propaganda materials of unconstitutional parties, associations, or other organizations within the meaning of § 86 of the Criminal Code, or showing them in the museum, will be excluded from visiting the museum. A ban from the premises may also be imposed. (Propaganda materials within the meaning of § 86 of the Criminal Code are those directed against the free democratic basic order or the idea of international understanding, and those directed against the existence or security of a state or an international organization or against the constitutional principles of the Federal Republic of Germany.)
- It is not allowed to touch or enter exhibition items. Exceptions are marked. Restricted areas must not be entered.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed in the exhibition rooms. Exceptions apply in designated areas (picnic zones).
- Stairs, passageways, and escape routes must be kept clear for safety reasons.
- Visitors are liable for all expenses and damages caused by their behavior.
- Parents, educators, and other legal guardians must supervise their charges throughout the entire visit. They are liable for the individuals entrusted to them.
- For safety reasons, only the designated paths should be used in the outdoor areas.
- Railway tracks and vehicles in the outdoor areas must not be entered.

- Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes and open flames are prohibited in the buildings of the German Museum of Technology. Smoking is generally prohibited in the outdoor areas and on the terrace of the 4th floor of the museum, including the use of e-cigarettes. The outdoor areas include the museum park and other outdoor areas such as courtyards, entrance areas on Trebbiner Straße, access behind the old building, etc. Specifically exempted due to their public character and free access are the areas in front of the Science Center Spectrum, parking lot P4, and the Historical Ladestraße. Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes are only permitted in designated smoking areas. Both the smoking ban and the designated smoking areas are clearly marked (e.g., by signs). An exception to the smoking ban and the use of e-cigarettes applies within the framework of closed events on the terraces on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th floors of the Neubau building as well as in the Museum Park and Ladestraße outdoor areas.
- Individuals who seriously violate the visiting regulations or pose a danger to the safety and order of the museum or to the safety of other visitors may be excluded from visiting the museum under the exercise of house rules. Furthermore, in cases of serious violations, a ban from the premises may be imposed.

#### **Photography and Filming**

Photography and filming (without tripod, without external flash) for private purposes are allowed. Please note the prohibition under section above of these visiting regulations.

Recordings for commercial purposes are only permitted with prior written approval and are subject to charges and fees.

#### **Guided Tours**

Expert guided tours through the museum are exclusively conducted by individuals authorized by the museum. These tours incur charges and are only possible by prior registration.

#### **Liability**

The museum shall not be liable for damages incurred by visitors through the use of the facilities and exhibition objects of the museum, unless there is intent or gross negligence on the part of the museum.
